#### Welcome to Newsletter No 15.

It's been a while since the previous Dorset Junior Chess newsletter so welcome back. In this newsletter, we **reflect** on **highlights** of some great junior chess from the last few months including the B&DCL league matches, the Bacchus League, the British Chess Championships, the Delancey UK Chess Challenge, plus many other local, national and international events. ## Highlights from the summer of 2022

#### 1. Dorset Chess Juniors shone in local events

Several Dorset juniors played in many of the local league teams, for Wessex and the 4NCL (both online and OTB). Some of these many highlights include:

B&DCL and Dorset League: Junior players in the main league teams included Southbourne's Jamie Doyle, Florence Spirling, Finn Schell and Poole's Zander Booth, Leo Camopy, and Harry Mercer.

#### 2. Dorset Juniors in action further afield.

➤ **British Chess Championships 2022**: Several Dorset juniors made the trip to the British Chess Championships in Torquay during August with mixed results.

**Ted Paul** (Dorchester) came joint 3<sup>rd</sup> in the week 1 U1900 with 3.5 from 7 rounds; **Larissa Cuthbert** (Southbourne) scored 3 from 7 in the week 1 U1600 and 2.5 from 5 in the Weekend Soanes; **Jamie Doyle** (Southbourne) scored 4 out of 7 in the U16 tournament and 2.5 from 7 in the Open Rapid; and **Florence Spirling** (Southbourne) also scored 2.5 out of 5 in the Weekend U1500 and 2.5 from 9 in the Weekend Blitz.

Czech Open: In latter part of July, Larissa Cuthbert (Southbourne) took part in the Under 1700 section of the Czech Open and performed well. Larissa scored 4½/9 with an excellent 1694 FIDE rating performance.

Delancey UK Chess Challenge: The Delancey UK Chess Challenge is the UK's largest Chess competition for young UK chess players under the age of 18 years, played across three stages: Megafinal, Gigafinal and Terafinal. Well done to Finn Schell and Max Teverson for making it through to the Gigafinals where both performed very well and narrowly missed out on qualification to the next level.

### **Looking forward**

Looking forward to the 2022/23 season, here are some chess activities and events to look out for:

Local junior chess clubs / coaching: The two local junior chess clubs have re-opened after the summer break. Joining a chess club is a great way to improve and make friends with other junior chess players.

Southbourne junior chess club at Tuckton Social Club, the home venue of Southbourne Chess Club, between 6pm to 7.20pm on Friday evenings.

School Chess Clubs and inter-school league: Several local secondary schools including Highcliffe, Twynham, Avonbourne, Lytchett Minster, Ringwood, Poole Grammar, Bournemouth School and BSG now have active school chess clubs, led by enthusiastic teachers with a passion for chess, and are keen to take part in a local school's league. We hope to have this up and running soon.
